The progressive pride flag was designed by Daniel Quasar in 2018, who added five arrow-shaped lines to the classic Rainbow Pride Flag.

The black and brown stripes are to represent marginalised LGBTQIA+ communities of colour, along with the colours pink, light blue and white, which are used on the Transgender Pride Flag.
