Battery Recycling

There are lots of reasons to keep your used batteries out of your kerbside bins including fires, and the spread of hazardous materials. But also, recycling used batteries correctly means we can make the most of existing resources! Win-win! Dispose of your used household batteries thoughtfully, and free of charge at Council's Splatt Street Office or in designated bins at the Swan Hill and Robinvale landfills.



Free mulch!

Did you know that mulched green waste is available to residents to self-load, free of charge all year round? Simply bring along a trailer to Swan Hill or Robinvale landfills and load as much as you like! **Disclaimer:** We can not guarantee mulch will be free of weeds or other contaminants.



Container Deposit Scheme

CDS has arrived in Swan Hill! With a collection point in Swan Hill and Robinvale, residents can return most drink containers (between 150mL – 3L) for a 10c refund. The scheme is funded by the beverage industry and will contribute to Victoria's target of diverting 80% of all municipal waste away from landfill by 2030. More exciting projects!

We're excited to announce that Swan Hill Rural City Council has been awarded funding from Victoria's Circular Economy Councils Fund for the following projects:

- Circular Agricultural Plastics Economy (CAPE) project will see agricultural plastic waste materials collected and remanufactured into fence posts, irrigation pipes and other farming essentials.
- A mattress processing and recycling facility will be established at the Swan Hill Transfer Station to dismantle end of life mattresses.
- A new compost facility will be established in Ultima and future green waste and food organics will be processed into compost.
