Rural Industry Information Guide

What you need to know before opening your business

Whether you are handling, treating, producing, processing, storing or packing animal or plant agricultural products for commercial purposes, you will likely require a permit from Council. There are several types of permits you may need, which are overseen by different departments at Council. Depending on what are you seeking to achieve, other State Government approvals may also be need to be involved in the permit process.

There are several regulatory permits you might need from Council, including:

- planning permit
- building permit
- health registration

Other approvals might need to be obtained from Council.

Considerations

When planning to build or expand an existing building, you will need to consider the following:

- Level of activity and on-site processes
- Number of workers
- Distance from other dwellings / buildings
- Proximity to flood / bush fire zones
- · Proximity to rivers or waterways
- · Surface materials used in construction







What licences, permits or advice might you need from external parties?

Depending on what are you seeking to achieve, other State Government authorities and organisations may also need to be involved in the permit process. Below is a list of authorities and organisations that you may need to contact. Have a discussion early with Council to gain a further understanding of the role they might play in the application process. Engagement with these authorities and organisations could impact permit approval times.

The Process:

STEP 1: DO YOUR RESEARCH

Before submitting an application, please ensure that you are familiar with the requirements of operating a rural based business, including:

- · How you will meet the regulations
- · What registration is required.

STEP 2: GATHER SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

Your application will need to include a floorplan (where applicable) showing:

- hand wash basin(s)
- · shelves, benches and tables
- ventilation
- clinical and related waste disposal

STEP 3: COMPLETE THE QUESTIONNAIRE

To complete the online business questionnaire, visit https://forms.swanhill.vic.gov.au/bpt/

STEP 4: COUNCIL ASSESSMENT

After your application is received, all documentation is reviewed internally by Council. Depending on the complexity of your application, you may be invited to a face-to-face 'pre-application' with relevant Council departments. Council will advise which permits you will need for your business.

STEP 5: OUTCOME

You will be provided with a copy of the outcome of your permit and/or registration application(s). Once you have been issued with the correct permits for your business you can start operating.

STEP 6: ONGOING SUPPORT

Stay in touch with Council for ongoing business support.
