Most of our regular buyers attended for the final sale the 2022 selling season at SHRLE. All weights & grades were supplied this week in seeing quotations fall across the board. Cows fell 20c/kg to 30c/kg & heavy cattle sold up to 30c/kg cheaper. Feeders fluctuated to finish between 25c/kg to 40c/kg in all grades.
