
Swan Hill Regional Livestock Exchange

<u>Did you know...</u>

Victoria is the Perfect Storm for an Emergency Animal Disease. Dense livestock population, close proximity of farm businesses leads to easier spread (i.e. daily milk collections, feed trucks, etc), Mixed species of pigs, sheep, beef - Ideal spread for diseases, Climatic conditions are right, High levels of interstate animal movement into Victoria to large processors

Preparedness - What role can producers play? An incursion of an emergency animal disease (EAD) such as Lumpy skin disease (LSD) or Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD) will require a coordinated response between producers, industry and government. That is **YOU**; the Farmer, the Agent, The Buyer, The Saleyard Operator, The Abattoir Operator, The Transporters, The Farm Worker, The Farm Visitor...you get the drift.

Everyone has a responsibility to remain alert to disease outbreak information and implement their own 'prevention measures'. - Similar to the situational awareness and preparedness we maintain over the summer season for fires. Talk to your local Agent or AgVic rep about what a Stock Standstill is and go online to learn more about AUSVET plan and EAD responses. MLA also has links and learning about your biosecurity plan is part of the LPA accreditation process.
