Sheep can rotate each ear to 180° to pick up sounds all around them. They can even rotate their ears in different directions from one another, enabling them to stay alert and notice any sounds that may be out of the ordinary. By doing this, sounds reach each ear at different times, amplifying the sounds and helping the sheep recognize any sound that is not familiar.

Sheep have such good hearing that they can recognise sounds up to 4km away. This means that sheep can easily track sounds as approaching the flock or traveling away from the flock. Sheep can also recognise sounds; they use this most often when trying to communicate with each other.
