Dr Helen Newton Turner radically changed merino sheep breeding in Australia. Encouraged by Ian Ross, whom at that time was head of the McMaster laboratory, she became one of the world's leading authorities on sheep genetics and worked with the CSIRO for over 40 years.

Closely related rams and ewes can have defective lambs. One defective gene is normally recessive, but if lambs inherit two copies of a defective gene that runs in the same family, they may have serious abnormalities. Inbreeding problems can occur in flocks that use own rams, or gets in rams from another flock which has similar family bloodlines.
