## Practical Biosecurity steps on farm...

Ensure your PIC details are up to date & you conduct timely uploads of livestock movements on the NLIS Database.

Have a biosecurity plan – promoting good farm hygiene practices to protect your property. Keep up to date & timely records of your livestock movements both on & off your property, ensuring they are accompanied by a Livestock Health Statement/Declaration.

When livestock arrive at your property, isolate & monitor them closely for any signs of sickness for up to 2 weeks (minimum of 7 days) before allowing them on the rest of your property. Ensure good fencing to keep your stock in in & others out. Understand the signs of disease & monitor regularly. Know & understand what contagious (ie.Warts). Have your Vet contact in your phone. All these things & more are easily implemented to keep your property safe & profitable.
