Did you know?

- Both Australian exports of grassfed beef and grainfed beef have grown so far this year, but grassfed exports grew substantially more.
- Grainfed exports increased by 7% from Q1 2023 to 115,834 tonnes carcass weight equivalent (cwe), while grassfed exports grew by 29% to 263,546 tonnes.
- In general, grainfed export volumes are considerably less variable compared to total production, while grassfed exports, which are relatively more exposed to variance in the cattle cycle, would be expected to increase more as production increases.
