Australian Animal Welfare Standards and Guidelines - Land Transport of Livestock – Edition 1, Version 1

Transport vehicles and facilities for livestock

- SA3.1 A person in charge must ensure that the vehicles and livestock handling facilities are constructed, maintained and operated in a way that minimises risk to the welfare of livestock. Vehicles and facilities must: i) be appropriate to contain the species; and ii) have effective airflow; and iii) have flooring that minimises the likelihood of injury or of livestock slipping or falling; and iv) be free from internal protrusions and other objects that could cause injury; and v) have sufficient vertical clearance for livestock to minimise the risk of injury.
- GA3.8 Flooring and surfaces should be designed to maximise grip and minimise slipping and falling. Strategies to improve grip include slats or grooves in the surface. If livestock are seen to be slipping and falling, the floor surface and handling of livestock should be examined and appropriate action taken to prevent the problem.
